# MANAGER'S NOTES

Today sees a break from League action in the FA Women's National League as we have a visit from local rivals Bristol Rovers in the FAWNL Plate competition, both teams having lost their earlier determining round ties. In our case it was away at Swindon Town. They will have made the short journey from North Bristol to the AJN Stadium.

As always it is the League programme that takes priority and I have my doubts if either team is enthused by the fact that the draw for the next round will see today's winners having to make the lengthy journey to newly Worthing. A pretty poor reward for victory today.



Our league form has been somewhat better than the results show. We have won one, drawn one and lost two fixtures. Last week's defeat at home to Moneyfields is a prime example. The 1-3 scoreline was a bit flattering to our opponents. They are a very well organised outfit and are likely to finish in the top three this season. We hit the bar when the score was 1-2 and that would possibly have been a turning point. Their goalkeeper managed a good save to tip the shot onto the bar. You can read the match report on that game later in the programme. The note has been put together by our roving reporter, Xanna Kierk, who has also taken on the editorial role for the programme at all home First team games.

For some time now, there has been clear evidence of a couple of trends. First, the step between Tier 3 and Tier 4 has been getting larger. So it is a pleasant feature that last season's South West Champions, Exeter City, have had such a strong start to the season and now sit at the very top of the Southern Premier Division. That is despite losing two key players, their long serving captain and their leading scorer from last year to other clubs. It has also been apparent for some time that the divide within a division has been getting wider too. Basically, a divide caused by the cheque book mania of some of the top clubs. Generally, those that have access to the resources of a Premier or EFL men's team. This has now developed a new feature that started along the South Coast. This involves the signing of an excessive number of players. Some people seem to think it is a deliberate strategy to ensure those 'excess' players are denied to rival divisional clubs. This policy depends on two aspects. The ability to attract these players with remuneration and secondly for the players concerned to be quite content to sit on the bench all season or even not be in this week's squad at all. They just want to say they are associated with a big name club and do not aspire to play each week. Let's see how long that lasts over a full season. It does, of course, mean that those players get pushed down to the FAWNL Reserve competition and radically distort opposition teams in what is designed to be for the development of very young players who aspire to play First team football in time.

Last Sunday also saw a defeat for our very young Development side which went down 0-2 away at Moneyfields. There is also a detailed report on that fixture from the manager, Sven Kierk. It appears that we should have got ahead through our first half chances, but these were not taken. The good news is that we have a young side this season which can compete well at this level.

A mention to of our talented U16 side who beat Yeovil Town 6-1 in the JPL Cup tie at home last Saturday. This Saturday, they entertain Exeter City at home and I hope to get the score in the programme as a stop press. On Sunday, they start their BGL U18 fixtures at Larkhall, where they will be playing two years up in terms of age group.

So, let's hope for an entertaining match today and pray the forecast of warmer weather materialises.

## SECRETARY'S VIEWS

Today we welcome Bristol Rovers Women to the AJN for an FAWNLI Plate game. Then on Thursday week, the 26th September they are back for an evening League game. Strange how we always seem to get to play games against the same opponents in quick succession, all down to the luck of the draw and the League keeping the first games local. It is the same with the Adobe Women's FA Cup.

Last week our referee had to pull out at the last minute through sickness and we were appointed a late referee all the way from Northampton. The assistant referee thought if he drove through the number plate recognition system in the car park and parked in the lane he would not have to pay the parking fee. Not so I'm afraid. All referees are notified of the car parking fees, to be paid on arrival, which the club refund so no reason not to pay, and every reason to pay to avoid a hefty charge from the private car parking company who operate the car park.

There is another round of grants from the League with applications due by the end of the month so that's one of my next jobs.

With the first team home three weeks in a row I look forward to having next Sunday off. There will, however, be a game here to watch next week with our Development team playing AFC Bournemouth Reserves which will be a tough one. Do come along and support our talented young team.

## AT THE AJN TODAY...

### **Bristol Rovers F.C. Women**

Bristol Rovers Women's are an English Women's football club situated in the north of Bristol.

The club relaunched in the spring of 2019 by Bristol Rovers Community Trust with a focus on community, education, participation and performance.

The former club was founded in the 1980's and enjoyed success in the regional leagues and a run to the semi finals of the FA Cup in 2001, losing to eventual winners Arsenal, and they reached the semi final stage of the competition on a further two occasions. In 2005 the club became known as Bristol Academy WFC.



With no women's team representing Bristol Rovers for 14 years, Nathan Hallett-Young and Matthew Davies founded the re-launched club with Community Trust CEO, Adam Tutton as Chairman.

From 2019 until the summer of 2024 the club remained under the stewardship of the Community Trust, rising through the leagues with promotions in the 20/21 season, 21/22 season and although narrowly missing out on promotion in 22/23 by just One point, there was a further promotion in 23/24 promoting the club to its current position in the Women's National League Division 1 South West.

During the summer of 2024, the club transferred to the management of Bristol Rovers Football Club, cementing the team as a part of the football club with training at the club training ground (The Quarters) and home games being played at the Memorial Stadium.

The club continues under the management of Nathan Hallett-Young supported by Chris Douglas as Assistant Manager, with Deb Phillips as Operations Manager. First team captain is Rianne Bourne-Hallett.

# MATCH REPORTS

## **MONEYFIELDS BANK WIN AGAINST FIGHTING KEYNSHAM**

Keynsham Town LFC hosted Moneyfields FC Women at the AJN Stadium.

Klaudia is tested early as she saves a one on one to her left post. Not long after, Moneyfields are awarded two quick corners which are defended well by Keynsham.

Keynsham eventually get free from Moneyfields pressure, but their first chance of the day is blown up for off side as Scarlett makes a run down the wing. Moneyfields come again, as Jade and Nellie show good defensive work. Vicky wins a free kick to relieve some pressure.

Keynsham are awarded their first corner of the game, which is well defended by Moneyfields. They look to hit Keynsham on the counter but two great saves from Klaudia keep the opposition at bay. Keynsham create a string of chances, starting with Ciera driving forward and finding Scarlett on the wing. After a good save from the Moneyfields keeper, and a defender closing down Nay's rebound, Moneyfields do enough to keep the score level. Keynsham come again, hitting Moneyfields on the counter attack as Scarlett hits the bar with a powerful volley from the wing.

21mins: Against the run of play, Moneyfields find their goal with an unfortunate bounce over Klaudia. 1-0 to Moneyfields.

23mins: Keynsham respond brilliantly! Vicky setting Nay through the defence as she cuts back and smashes the ball into the net! 1-1 at the AJN Stadium.

Knowing getting the second goal is crucial, both teams are giving it their all. Lorna and Lily are keeping their attackers at bay, whilst Scarlett and Vicky provide pressure on their defence.

32mins: it's Moneyfields who find the second goal as Keynsham struggle to get the ball out of their own half. 2-1 to Moneyfields.

A controversial decision from the linesman sees Moneyfields break through on the wing. But great reactions from Klaudia prevent it ending in another goal.

Klaudia makes another great save to her right side after seeing it late through a crowd of players. Moneyfields are awarded another corner. Jade saves Keynsham twice as she clears the corner with a commanding header and then takes the rebound to her face.

HT: Keynsham 1-2 Moneyfields. Lily R comes on for Immi S as a fresh pair of legs.

Five minutes into the second half, Moneyfields are awarded a free kick in a dangerous area. Keynsham block the shot with a well placed wall. Subs are made with Emma coming off after struggling with her calf. Bea goes on into the midfield and Nellie drops to defence. The midfield and defence work well together to keep Moneyfields at bay, resulting in a quieter first 15 minutes. Nellie and Lorna clean up well on the wing.

65mins: Ciera's run through the middle forces the oppositions goalkeeper to be quick off her line. But Moneyfields hit back with a counter attack. A good finish from the striker sees the away team go 3-1 up.

Keynsham look to respond with a good cross from Scarlett. Vicky got caught in a 50/50 with the goalkeeper and the ball is cleared.

25mins into the second half, Scarlett is awarded a well deserved rest. Hannah replaces her on the wing. Hannah is straight into the action, linking up with our left back. Lily W delivers a good cross to Ciera who hits it with her left. Somehow the ball remains out of the goal.

Keynsham hold on well as Moneyfields hit a dangerous ball from the wing. Eventually the ball is cleared after multiple blocks on the line.

### BRAVE KEYNSHAM DEVELOPMENT RUE MISSED CHANCES

Keynsham travelled south to visit Moneyfields for their first League fixture of the season. Moneyfields have had a busy summer, having recruited lots of new players from nearby Portsmouth.

It was dry & muggy conditions - played at the brand new 3.5 million facilities at the John Jenkins stadium.

Moneyfield showed some good passing and movement in the opening exchanges, a dangerous cross flashed across the Keynsham goal. But Keynsham didn't take long to get into their stride. Alice & Ella combined neatly - Ella's great thru ball saw Jenna narrowly offside. Megan almost released Jenna again, but the keeper just won the race to the ball. Loz with a superb challenge on the edge of the Keynsham area - before great playing out from the back by Keynsham saw Alice almost fashion an opening for Jenna.

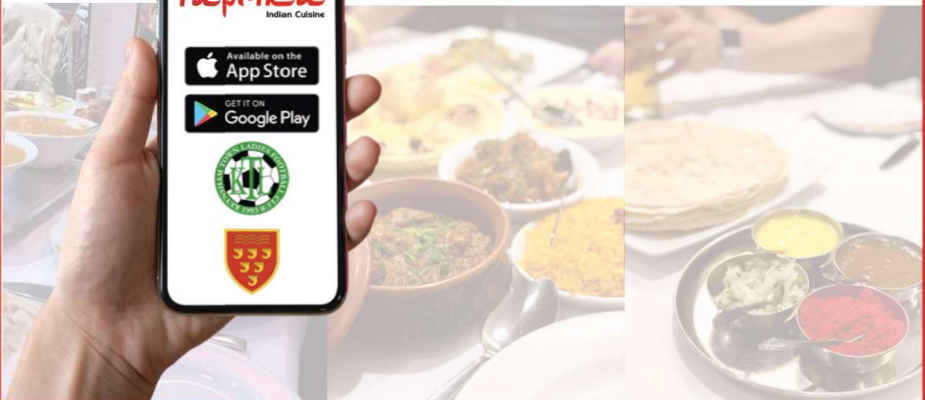
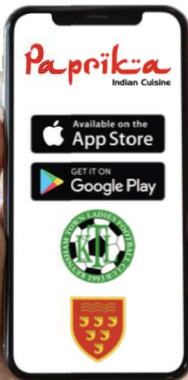

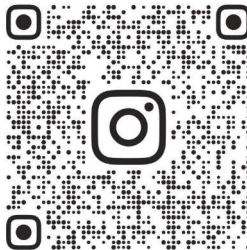
