Manager's Notes...

Here we are embarking on a long postponed FA Women's Cup First Round Proper tie.

Originally, this tie was scheduled to be played on November 12th and our opponents, Marine Academy Plymouth chose to play the tie at Ivybridge FC's Erme Valley ground as their own home ground at Manadon in Plymouth had problems meeting the requirements for the FA Women's Cup competition.

We were looking forward to playing at Erme Valley, a South West Peninsular Premier League ground, where to my knowledge, this club has never played. That match scheduled for the 12th of November was postponed as the pitch there was unfit. Marine Academy Plymouth were kind enough to arrange a pitch inspection on the Saturday evening to make sure that we were not faced with a disrupted and costly Sunday morning decision.

The tie was, therefore, rearranged for the following Sunday 19th November and the same procedures saw that tie called off for the second time on the Saturday evening. Indeed, the men's Reserve game planned for the Saturday afternoon at Erme Valley had already been called off.

So, the FA regulations for Cup ties that are postponed in this competition swung into action. These stipulate that if there are two postponements of a tie, then the third attempt at playing the game has to be reversed to the nominated ground for the away team.

That is how we have arrived at today's match. It may provide us with a slight advantage, but topping the Premier League of the South West Regional League means that Marine Academy Plymouth will still be tough competition.

These FA Women's Cup ties have their own substitution rules that differ markedly from those we are used to in the FA Women's National League. We can name up to seven substitutes today, compared with five in a League game. When it comes to using the substitutes, where you can use all five of the substitutes in a League match, only three can be used in the Cup competition. This means that there may be up to four players who do not get to play at all. If, however, the tie goes to extra time, if it is drawn at the end of 90 minutes, then an additional substitute can be introduced during the 30 minutes of extra time.

That is how we have got to today's tie at the AJN Stadium. Naturally, we hope that our opponents have had a safe journey from Devon. Today also sees a change in the appointed officials and we welcome them also to Keynsham.

Supporters will know that the second round draw for the FA Women's Cup has already been made and it is listed in full later in this programme. The winners today will play an away tie at Bristol Rovers, which if it were ourselves would only mean a short trip across Bristol, but another longish trip if Marine Academy Plymouth were successful today. That tie will have to be played next Sunday, 3rd December and we will know the draw for the 3rd Round as it will be made on Monday at 3pm and that tie will be played on Sunday 10th December.

Supporters will see that we have been given an extra League fixture for this calendar year as we are to play table topping Bournemouth at home on Sunday 17th December, despite being assured by the old Management Committee at the June AGM that there would be no fixture on that pre-Christmas date. Typical FA.

We are working hard to add a couple of players to the 1st team squad and hope this completes before the second half of the season.

For your information the FA will be hosting the draw, broadcasting live from Wembley Stadium at 3pm. It will debut on the FA's new Instagram account @adobewomensfaceup in collaboration with @shesaballer, so you can follow in advance to avoid missing any of the draw. We are told ball numbers will be circulated to Clubs involved in the draw tomorrow morning. This could be us or it could be Marine Academy Plymouth and then there is still the Bristol Rover's game before anyone knows for certain. The Third Round Proper Fixtures are set to take place on Sunday 10th December. Then on 17th December we have been given a League game home to AFC Bournemouth.

Keynsham Town Development were in the Premier Division of the South West Women's Regional League a few years back with Marine Academy and they are a team to be respected. I anticipate an interesting and entertaining game.
