# MANAGER'S NOTES

Good afternoon and welcome to the AJN Stadium for this afternoon's rearranged game against Southampton.

Originally, the FA Women's National League designated this match as an away fixture for us, but Southampton contacted us and because their home pitch at the Test Park in Southampton was not available and with so many other pitch locations involved in the first games in the Adobe Women's FA Cup, they were finding it very difficult to find an alternative venue for this scheduled match. Consequently, they asked if we would be able to reverse the fixture and count it as our home game. We will now visit Southampton in early January 2025. As a measure of appreciation, Southampton were happy to fund the officials' costs for today.



With our Development team drawn away at Maidenhead, we had availability, hence the fact that the match is taking place today in Keynsham.

Apologies that I will again not be present today. My chest infection is as bad as I could imagine and I will certainly need a few more days to recover. Meanwhile, Justine Lorton with Avril Cooke are fully up to the task, covering recent matches as well as today.

Southampton have had a slow start assembling their side for this season's competition. Indeed, this is their first game. Nevertheless, they should not be underestimated as they have a long history in the female game.

Our season has got off to a mixed start with one League defeat and one draw, plus the loss in the League Cup determining round. The home game with Swindon was a bit hard to take with a player that we were so close to signing scoring twice against us in the 4-2 defeat. At Portishead, the match was a bit sub standard we went 1-0 down and although we equalised in the second half, we just could not find a winner, although Ciera had a very marginal decision go against her after netting. She also collected our equalising goal and is proving to be a goalscoring midfielder.

On Thursday, at Swindon, we played possibly our best football of the season and missed several chances to equalise and make it 2-2, We certainly controlled the second half only to see a dodgy penalty awarded against us in injury time to come away with a 1-3 loss.

It has been a very busy and successful pre-season time for our Development squad. A 4-1 win away at Portishead Reserves, showed a difference in class and the problem of their Reserve side playing to far below their first team, a 3-1 win away at Corsham Town and a 2-0 win at Purton last Thursday give this young and talented squad confidence for the coming season. They have their very first FA National League fixture today, when they travel to Maidenhead for the Determining round of the League Cup/ Plate, knowing that they have a further game to come in either the League Cup or Plate competitions.

Let's hope the weather remains fine this afternoon and the football is attractive and successful.

## SECRETARY'S VIEWS

Today we are pleased to welcome Southampton Women in a fixture rehearsal as Southampton had problems finding a pitch with September 1st being the First Round Qualifying in the Adobe Women's FA Cup.

Tier 4 clubs don't enter the Adobe Women's Cup competition until the Third Round Qualifying game which will take place on Sunday 8th December so a date for the diary.

Last week we played Swindon Town in the FAWNL Cup determining round. As we lost we now go into the FAWNL Plate Competition. The draw for the next round, which is the Preliminary Round, for the Cup and Plate has been made but is under embargo, like most other notices I receive, until tomorrow (Monday) afternoon after which we will post it on our social media pages – watch that space! This season for the first time ever the FAWNL are awarding a small amount of prize money. Winners of Round 1 of the Cup will receive £400 and the losers £100. For the Plate competition the winners of the quarter finals will receive £500 and the losers £125.

This is separate from the FAWNL Reserve Cup and Plate competition. Our Development team play in the First Round of the FAWNL Reserve Cup away to Maidenhead United Development at 2pm today. We wish them good luck. Their first League game of the season is next Sunday, 8<sup>th</sup> September away to Moneyfields Reserves. Next Sunday, by coincidence, the first team are home to Moneyfields Firsts.

We are awaiting for our Stadium Accreditation Assessment to be corrected as there were a number of inaccuracies. We don't know exactly when this will be as they have replied that they have a high volume of emails to deal with in relation to this matter, presumably from other Clubs whose reports are not accurate. We know of one club whose pitch was described as a sloping grass pitch when they have upgraded to 3G. We were described as having inadequate third changing rooms, by which they were referring to the old changing rooms at the end of the building, which have not been used for years and are full of junk, spiders etc!!

## AT THE AJN TODAY...

### **Southampton Women F.C.**

Southampton Women's Football Club was established in 1970, making the club the oldest and most successful women's team in Southampton, winning the Women's FA Cup eight times between 1971 and 1982.



Southampton Women's FC is now a completely renovated club with two senior sides and a flourishing youth development programme.

As Hampshire League Champions at the end of the 2015/16 season, the club was promoted to the Southern Region Premier League. The team achieved the league and cup double in the 2016/17 season and had successful cup runs in the County Cup and FA Cup.

Back to back promotion for the Firsts meant promotion to the formerly named FA Women's Premier League in 2017-18, whilst the Reserves won the Hampshire County Women's League Division 1 as undefeated champions and moved into the Southern Region. The first under-16s team were league runners-up too.

The team is their seventh season in Tier 4 now known as the FA Women's National League Division One South West. Southampton narrowly missed out on promotion to the Southern Premier in their first two seasons in Division One South West.

In 2022 the club began a rebrand through a collaboration with Kit and Bone that started with a new badge before the launch of the "Sirens" nickname to help differentiate themselves from Southampton FC Women, "Saints".

Their most recent honour came in April 2023 when they lifted the Southampton Divisional FA Cup winning on penalties against Eastleigh in the Community.

Southampton Women's FC recently confirmed the appointment of Aaron Smith as the new club Chair. Smith left the club in 2023 after four seasons as First Team manager, where his most notable achievements in his tenure was an FA Cup Fourth Round finish in the 2019/20 season, and being back-to-back SDFC Cup finalists - lifting the trophy in 2023.

## INTERESTING FACT..

**Giuseppe Bergomi played in four World Cups - but never in a qualifier.**

'The Uncle' was a late call-up to the 1982 squad at the age of 18, playing in the final three matches of the tournament - but he wasn't a regular during the qualifying process for the tournament. As holders in 1986, Italy didn't have to qualify, while in 1990, The Azzurri held the tournament. After being dropped under Arrigo Sacchi, Bergomi was a late call-up for 1998, when he made three appearances.

# MATCH REPORT

Keynsham travelled along the M4 to face Swindon Town in the League Cup - a midweek fixture, under the floodlights, at the impressive Swindon Supermarine FC venue.

Keynsham started positive and the game was evenly contested. Scarlett M in particular was a constant threat down the Keynsham right. Both teams were creating chances - but Swindon were creating the better and took the lead when Keynsham couldn't clear their lines and the Swindon striker found the bottom corner with a fierce strike. (1-0)

Brooke STIRRUP almost connected with a cross - before Nay C looked to have raced clear, but for a late offside call. Keynsham's midfield were battling and the defence strong - with Jade RADBURN excelling at the heart of it.

Swindon doubled their lead in fortuitous fashion when a challenge between Keynsham Goalkeeper, Klaudia WOJTYCZKA and a Swindon player - saw the ball land favourably for the Swindon player to tap into the empty net. (2-0)

Keynsham didn't seem phased and a strong finish to the half - saw them reduce the arrears - when Lily WITHERS driving run, beating 3 players, saw her cynically upended and Naomi CLIPSTON stepped up to smash the penalty into the bottom corner, giving the Swindon keeper zero chance. (2-1)

Swindon seemed rattled and CLIPSTON almost drew her team level with a thunderous strike that smashed the crossbar!

The referee's whistle halted Keynsham's progress and brought an end to the action.

Swindon started the second half strongly - but aside of the first 5 minutes - Keynsham dominated the half with an excellent team performance, which saw Swindon hanging on at times.

Ciera LUNDY now partnered with Immi STOCKER and Beatriz KRETTEIS saw all three winning a lot of possession and driving their team forward. Scarlett M went close - KEYNSHAM were swarming Swindon - but, Swindon were defending well and Keynsham also had to be alert to the counter attack.

Keynsham's best chance arrived with 10 mins left - when Naomi CLIPSTON hit the underside of the bar from 30 yards - with the Swindon keeper well beaten. Hannah PRICE fired the rebound on target, which the keeper repelled back to her - but Swindon's defence then scrambled the ball clear.

Swindon were hanging on, but as the clock ticked into injury time, a rare Swindon break saw the referee award a very soft penalty - when Lily WITHERS clearly won the ball and the Swindon players momentum saw her kick Lily. Klaudia almost saved the resulting penalty, but it had too much power and despite going the right way and getting a hand to it, the ball fired high into the net.

Keynsham deserved better and bravely camped in the Swindon half for the remainder of the game still searching for goals.

# MATCH REPORT

## CHOPPER'S CORSHAM CUT DOWN TO SIZE Corsham Town 1-3 Keynsham Town Development

Keynsham Devs accepted a last minute request from ex coach, Ian "Chopper" Harris' Corsham to fill in for cancelled opponents and visited the Southbank stadium for a Thursday floodlight fixture. A tough game was expected - with Corsham formidable in their quest to win the League and Cup last season, and fielding several players with WNL experience. Losing isn't something they are accustomed to.

The pitch looked better than it played and the opening exchanges saw Keynsham a little sloppy with their passing and Corsham trying to use Shannon Redhouse's pace up front.

The home side took an early lead - when Redhouse wriggled free down the left and her cross was bundled home by ex Keynsham favourite, Darcey Banfield, whose effort bobbed over the unfortunate Chloe J in the Keynsham goal. (1-0)

Keynsham didn't panic and were seeing a lot of the ball, Jessie A, Kirsty S & Angel W were winning key duels. Scarlett M flashed a couple of efforts at goal. Whilst the Keynsham defence of Jas S, Mandy H, Zoe HG and Ella G started to get a grip on Corsham's only real threat up front. Alice T and Jess B started to grow into the game on the Keynsham flanks.

With Keynsham firmly in the ascendancy - but struggling to break through the last line of the Corsham defence, it sensed we needed something special which duly arrived right on HT - when Kirsty S fed Jessie A - who fired in a thunderbolt of a rocket from 30 yards out (1-1) - game very much ON!!

The half time team talk - was very much centred around more of the same - increasing the quality and taking our chances. Scarlett took a rest - with Angel now in the false 9. Keynsham were playing all the football - a commanding performance throughout - as Corsham seemingly lacked ideas and resulted to long ball punts for Shannon R to chase.

Zoe and Mandy were dominating her on the whole and Chloe showed some good handling and clearances to mop up any time she did almost break thru. Jas, Mandy and Ruby were snapping into tackles!

Angel fired Keynsham into a well deserved lead on 60 mins - after a superb pinch and driving run by Alice T. Angel showed great composure to smash the ball high into the net. (1-2)

Kirst had done brilliantly for her 60 minutes, only her second outing since giving birth last July. Scarlett dropped into midfield with Angel, who had been causing the Corsham backline headaches, staying in the false 9. Corsham were getting more and more frustrated, but Keynsham kept piling forward - a couple of borderline physical challenges did nothing to stop Keynsham's desire and spirit to win the game.

Keynsham were playing some lovely flowing football now. Ruby was dominating - Scarlett, Jessie, Angel fantastic little interchanges. Jess B flashed a couple of dangerous crosses in, Alice T was unplayable at times - supported brilliantly by Ella G on the left.

Corsham were hanging in there as the game drifted into the latter stages, the only thing missing from a Keynsham pov - was a bigger score line - Alice T soon put pay to that with another driving run into enemy lines, her cross found Scarlett M on the far post and she rifled a left footed shot high past the keeper to seal the win! # RULE CHANGES..

## NEW REFEREE GUIDANCE FOR SEASON 2024-25

There are three main changes that players and spectators need to be aware of..



The first relates to Handball in the penalty area. The new law tries to differentiate between deliberate and accidental Hand Ball.

If the denying of a clear goalscoring opportunity is not deliberate then the card issued will be Yellow and a penalty kick awarded.

If the Handball is deemed deliberate, then a red card and a penalty will be awarded.

The second change relates to encroaching into the penalty area, when a penalty is being taken. If the encroachment by a player has no impact on the conversion or the miss of a penalty kick, then the result stands with no re-take.

If the player encroaching has an impact on the kick taken (eg puts away a rebound from a post), then the kick must be retaken.

Maybe this will just lead to more encroachment...

The third important change concerns the use of the Sin Bin.

This was introduced in order to stop dissent, especially when directed at a referee. Sin Bin lasts 10 minutes until there is a stoppage of play, such as a throw in, which allows the player to return.

The new rule specifies that the sending to the Sin Bin will count as a Yellow card offence and will also carry a £12 fine from the County FA. As such, it means that dissent is punished more than a Yellow card given for a poor foul as it also involves 10 minutes off the field.

Some referees don't seem to like being questioned politely, it's no surprise that one of our Club contacts in the North has told players not to even look at the referee, let alone speak to them!!

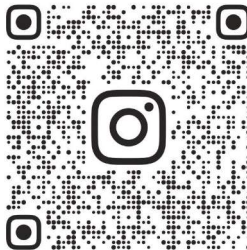

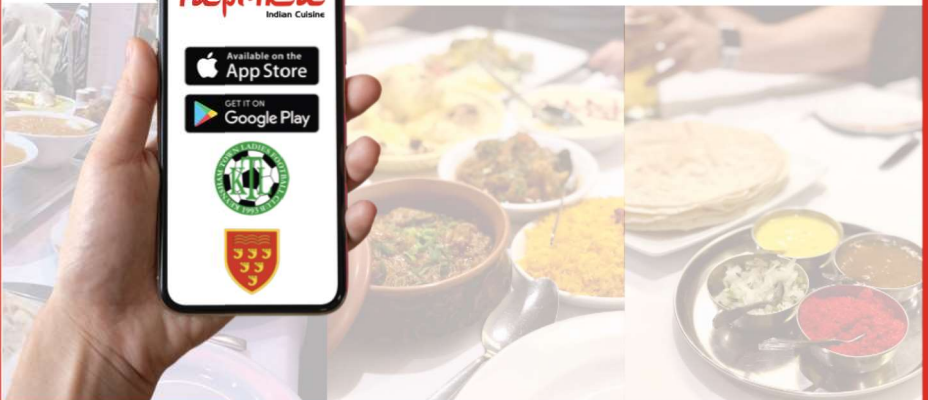
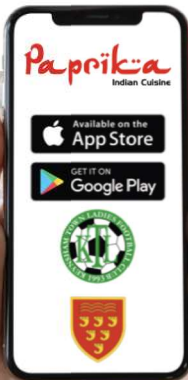
