Manager's notes

The first league game of the season brings us a home fixture against Swindon and we welcome them to the AJN Stadium after the short drive from Wiltshire, Always strong opponents in recent, they have been busy with around nine new signings for the new season.

Ouselves, we have some changes too. Celyn Garton, who has been our central defender for some time goes to Cardiff Met for a degree course and will not be available this season. Vicky Vipond and Olivia Bees are away on holiday for the first couple of games.

We have three important new players, Klaudia Wojtyczka has joined us as First Team Goalkeeper from Pontypridd Utd to replace Charlie Haynes who has left us after seven years between the sticks. Klaudia is a

proven shot stopper and has excellent distribution skills.

Ciera Lundy has joined us from the New York Shockers, where she was the leading scorer from midfield and Beatriz Kretteis, who has arrived via Grambling College, can play in several attacking positions.

We also welcome back Lorna Coates from her maternity break to add pace and experience to our back line.

Add to these experienced players, improving younger players in the squad, Scarlett Mills, Immi Stocker and Alice Tanner plus Marita Clarke from Bristol University to give us a balanced squad.

Ironically, we have been drawn away against Swindon in the determining round of the FAWNL League Cup on the 28th August, with the winner going into the League Cup competition and the entering the Plate competition. Our next 1st team home game will not be until the 8th September when we entertain a strong Moneyfields side. In between, we have away trips to Portishead on Sunday 25th August (playing at Hallen FC for that fixture) and to Southampton on the 1st of September. The full fixture lists are available for both Senior teams further on in this programme, although the schedule for the second half of the Reserve division games has not been fixed yet.

This year we have a very young but talented Development team in the FAWNL Reserve League (South West Division). This reflects a move from recreational players to aspirational players and reflects the players that Mark Graham has brought with him since joining the club. Mark is a UEFA 'B' coach with a particular skill in developing young players capable of progressing to the First team in due course. To emphasise that change, the name Reserve team has been altered to Development team.

One of these players, Jessie A has already played two games for the First team in friendlies, so it is a developing process. Today, we introduce another young player, Zoe HG to the squad after reports of her excellent game on Thursday at Portishead.

The Development side do not start the season until Sunday 1st September and so their friendly games are scheduled a bit later than the First team. The first of these was at Portishead Reserves on Thursday evening and resulted in a comfortable success 4-0. You can read the detailed match report from Sven Kierk later in this programme and stay on to watch them in action after this game when they kick off at 4.30pm against Cheltenham Civil Service.

So, it just remains for me to trust that we all see an entertaining match this afternoon.

SECRETARY'S VIEWS

It's that time of year again when we welcome everyone to the AJN Stadium for a new season. Today we face Swindon Town Women and no doubt it will be a very competitive game.

We've been busy in the closed season and have a lot of young players joining us. As a consequence we have renamed our Reserves as Keynsham Town Ladies Development, as we feel that is more appropriate, and our coaching team will be developing these talented young players, who all aspire to play for the First team.

Referee costs have increased again this season, with the main referee commanding £55 a game and each assistant now £40 before expenses which means it will be regular payments of circa £200 for each home game. Despite this we have decided to keep the entry fee at £5 for adults and children free, plus a free programme which we think is extremely good value.

This week we've had a few problems with one assistant referee unable to attend and two others crying off until the final appointment late Saturday morning. The FA have a pool of referees for our games and I do wonder why they seem to send us the appointments before the referees have confirmed. Fortunately I didn't send out to them as soon as the replacement appointments were made.

There's some grants we applied for but unfortunately didn't get. Making the changing rooms more female friendly was one we didn't get but we are hoping to be successful with other grants to achieve this. We have done all the work on costings etc so it will just be a question of applying and keeping our fingers crossed. We also wanted to put a perimeter barrier around the concrete wall.

We would like to thank Brooke's mum for valiantly manning the gate. We do need other volunteers so that we can open the bar and look after the referees and players. At this level we have to provide refreshments on arrival, at half time and after the game. Stewards would also be useful. If you think you could help with any of this then we would be glad to hear from you.

Meanwhile enjoy today's game and don't ask me who the players are – names are in the programme.

Swindon Town Women F.C.

Swindon Town Ladies were formed in 1993 and joined the Southern Region Women's Football League. Playing in Division Four they played their first competitive fixture on Sunday 5th September away to Southampton Reserves, winning by four goals to one.

The first home league match was played on Sunday 10 October against Reading Royals, The game, played at Wootton Bassett, was "Kicked – Off" by Doreen

Dart the Mayor of Thamesdown (as it was then) with the Town winning by eight goals to two. Swindon finished their first season as Division Four League Champions and also won the Southern Region 5-a-Side Tournament.

In the next two seasons, Swindon Town Ladies were Champions of Divisions Three and Two respectively.In their first season in Division One they finished in mid-table and supplied eight players to the newly formed Wiltshire County Ladies team that won the South West Counties Championship.

The 1998-99 Season saw Swindon Town Ladies elected to be founder members of the F.A. South West Combination League, They finished the inaugural season in Third place and won the "Ambassador" South West Combination League Cup, beating Cheltenham 4-0 in the Final. The Town also set a record when the starting line-up of the County Women's Team were all from the same club. In the 1999-2000 season the Town again finished third in the League and retained the League Cup by beating League Champions Newport 1-0 in the Final. The 2000-01 season saw the Town finish third once again and win the League Cup for the third consecutive season, beating Cheltenham in the Final by Four goals to two.

In the 2006 – 2007 season saw the club moved towards single aged banding and ran teams from under 8; 9; 10; 11; 12; 13; 14; and since the age requirement to play Senior football has been raised from 14 to 16, under 15 and 16 teams were also added, giving the total number of players within the club in excess of 140 players.

With the structure of women's football in England being re-organised due to the introduction of FA WSL 2 in 2014, Swindon Town were moved into the new South West Division One of the FA Women's Premier League for the 2014-15 season. They almost won the division at their first attempt, but a three-point deduction for fielding an ineligible player cost them the title, leaving them in third place at the end of the season, just one point off the top of the table. They were to go one better the following season, carrying off the title to reach Tier 3 for the first time in their history.

The club's ambition is to regain their Tier 3 status and did well in the league last season, finishing in fourth place whilst hot shot striker Annie Colston lifted the division's Golden Boot at the end of the campaign.

Richard Wood has returned as manager for the 2024-25 season and with a number of new signings in their squad. Swindon will be looking ahead to the new season with confidence.

Rule Changes...

NEW REFEREE GUIDANCE FOR SEASON 2024-25

There are three main changes that players and spectators need to be aware of..

The first relates to Handball in the penalty area. The new law tries to differentiate between deliberate and accidental Hand Ball.



If the denying of a clear goalscoring opportunity is not deliberate then the card issued will be Yellow and a penalty kick awarded.

If the Handball is deemed deliberate, then a red card and a penalty will be awarded.

The second change relates to encroaching into the penalty area, when a penalty is being taken. If the encroachment by a player has no impact on the conversion or the miss of a penalty kick, then the result stands with no re-take.

If the player encroaching has an impact on the kick taken (eg puts away a rebound from a post), then the kick must be retaken.

Maybe this will just lead to more encroachment...

The third important change concerns the use of the Sin Bin.

This was introduced in order to stop dissent, especially when directed at a referee. Sin Bin lasts 10 minutes until there is a stoppage of play, such as a throw in, which

allows the player to return.

The new rule specifies that the sending to the Sin Bin will count as a Yellow card offence and will also carry a £12 fine from the County FA. As such, it means that dissent is punished more than a Yellow card given for a poor foul as it also involves 10 minutes off the field.

Some referees don't seem to like being questione politely, it's no surprise that one

of our Club contacts in the North has told players not to even look at the referee, let alone speak to them!!


