MANAGER'S NOTES

Today sees the FAWNL fixture against Abingdon United. We do not have a very good record against today's opponents from our encounters last season. At home, in the comparable match last season, we lost by a margin of 1-3. This season has not gone so well for Abingdon, but they have been picking up of late with their results beating Southampton 4-0 and drawing 0-0 at Maidenhead in their past two games to put them in 9th position in the division.. Indeed, their away from is quite good with 3 of their 5 games resulting in points from a Won 1, Drawn 2 and Lost 2 matches, with a goal difference of 7 v 8.



Our own record of late has been mixed, but the 4-1 home victory against Worthing last week was a welcome return to winning ways and we hope to continue that theme today and cement our 5th position in the League.

Today, the League in its wisdom has scheduled both our First team and Development side home fixtures at the same time and both at the AJN Stadium, which is an obvious impossibility. Consequently, we have had to make alternative arrangements for our Development game against Moneyfields Reserves which will now take place at Hengrove Athletics' Whitchurch ground at the same time of 2pm. Let's hope that the weather forecast is not as daunting as projected.

Technically, we have no fixture next week (1st December) for the First team, when the Development squad is playing Cheltenham Development at home with a 2pm kick off. We are mindful, that we can be given an additional First team fixture up to 5pm on the Tuesday prior to any Sunday, so anything is possible to cause unexpected problems.

On the 8th December, both teams travel to Swindon, no doubt to different venues and the following week, on 15th December, the FA Women's fixture arrangements have again caused us some more chaos with a double fixture booking as the First Team are home to Portishead and the Development team are to play a very good Portsmouth side also at home and at 2pm. Hopefully we can sort out some accommodation for this clash.

The football world has been dismayed by the decision of our Governing body, the Football Association to impose a 6 match ban on an autistic female teenager (17) who's only crime was to ask a bearded trans player 'Are you a man'. The FA need to sort out their rules on biological males playing in women and girls' football as most other sports seem to be doing to eliminate these unfair situations. If it was the other way around and happening in men's football action would be taken. There can be no respect for a governing body that makes these sorts of decisions. The panel who gave out the penalty was the FA National Serious Case Panel. What a huge waste of time and effort as it sounds more like a Star Chamber in Medieval or Soviet days. There was a demonstration of several hundred people at the England v Republic of Ireland game with additional protests planned. We may give this situation more detailed coverage in a later programme.

Finally, may I wish all spectators an entertaining game today.

Both Abingdon and ourselves were relieved to be told that it was a mistake and the date should actually be 24th November. Phew!

The Fixtures Secretary, however, did us no favours in rescheduling this game for today as our Development had already been given a League Reserve fixture here at the same time on the same date, against Moneyfields Reserves. So it was a mad scramble at the beginning of this week to find an alternative venue. We wish them good luck today. The league are trying to fix some mini tournaments between the top of two reserve divisions and the bottom of those two reserve divisions viz; South West and South. We won't, of course, know until later in the season but we can make an inspired guess as to who are opponents will be.

The League have told us to reach out for help in meeting minimum standards. Having stayed in all last Monday, however, we heard nothing. It seems to be happening quite often that we send emails to the League and get no response. They are probably snowed under with Clubs asking for help. Anyway they seemed to have fixed a webinar this Wednesday to show us what to do. What we actually need are several pairs of hands to do it. Perhaps Santa's elves can help but I think they may be a bit busy at this time of the year.

Abingdon United Football Club was founded in 1946 as a club to serve its local community in the town of Abingdon. The Women's side was setup in 2017.



After winning the Southern Region Women's League Premier in the 2022/23 season, the Club won promotion to the FA Women's National League for the first time in its history.

After being placed in the FAWNL Division One South West, Abingdon United's first season in Tier Four of the English Women's Football System saw an impressive 5th placed finish was achieved.

For the 2024/25 season, United will once again compete in the FA Women's National League Division One South West.

INTERESTING FACT..

Robert Earnshaw is the only player to have scored a hat-trick in all three divisions of the English Football League, the Premier League, the League Cup, FA Cup, and for his country at International level.

His first hat-trick came in the FA Cup for Cardiff City against Bristol Rovers in November 2000; a month later, he netted three against Torquay United in what is now League Two. In September 2002, he scored his first League Cup hat-trick for Cardiff against Boston United, and in November of that year, he scored another three against Queens Park Rangers for his first League One hat-trick. In 2003, he scored a Championship hat-trick for Cardiff against Gillingham, in 2004, he scored three for Wales against Scotland and in 2005, he completed a quite unique collection, scoring a Premier League hat-trick for West Bromwich Albion against Charlton Athletic.

MATCH REPORTS

KEYNSHAM TOWN 4 WORTHING FC WOMEN 1

Keynsham welcomed Worthing FC to the AJN Stadium. After a tough loss away in the FAWN plate, our girls were determined to do their club justice.

Mia gave the team a rallying call on kick off "Let's go Keynsham, come on darlings! Wooooo!"

The game starts oddly as the Worthing defender steps awkwardly on the ball and goes down. Nay takes advantage and gets a far shot off at the keeper, who fumbles the shot out for a corner. Scarlett puts in a dangerous corner for Keynsham to attack. Worthing struggle to clear but make clever blocks to deny Ciera and Lily's shots.

Both teams struggle to get the ball out of the middle. Eventually Worthing break free and win a corner from Emma's tackle. Jade heads the cross away for another Worthing corner.

Worthing's keeper comes far out to clear a ball, but Lily W is there to win it back. As she runs clean through, she gets tactically fouled.

Both teams get a few half chances but nothing comes from them. Vicky wins the ball on the edge of the box but is surrounded quickly and couldn't find the space to get a shot away. Klaudia finally gets tested from a long shot and displays some excellent handling.

Nay and Bea link up beautifully to get the ball wide to Scarlett, who unfortunately is blown for offside. Ciera spots the keeper off her line and looks to take advantage but her shot lacked the power.

Keynsham are getting closer but don't seem to have the luck today. Nay hits the post from a brilliant far out volley, the Worthing keeper getting a telling touch and Worthing clear for another Keynsham corner.

25- Scarletts delivery is again good and Lily WITHERS heads home to give Keynsham the lead (1-0)!!

Worthing win a free kick out wide from a soft challenge given against Ciera. Jade clears with ease. Keynsham hit back with Vicky sending the ball into Scarlett on the corner of the 6 yard box. Worthing defender displays good strength to keep her at bay, as the ball is collected by the keeper.

Vicky wins another corner for Keynsham. Scarlett delivers and Nay heads the ball towards Bea on the post, who flicks it over the line. Unfortunately she is called offside by the linesman.

The game is really end-to-end as Worthing take a turn attacking. Some good blocks from the defense keep them quiet, as they eventually go offside. Worthing win a few strings of corners but some good blocks from Ciera, Emma and Nay keep Keynsham in the lead. Keynsham win a breather as Worthing finally blast the ball over the bar.

Klaudia, Lorna and Jade are calm at the back with the ball and wait for a good opening. Jade sends Vicky through but the keeper is quick off her line to clear. Bea wins Keynsham another free kick on the halfway line. Ciera channels her inner strength and blasts the ball narrowly over the bar.

Worthing are looking more dangerous but Lorna, Lily W and Bea work together to keep them at bay.

Keynsham finally get a goal kick to quiet the game down. The goal kick gets sent to Ciera but a player shoves her in the back and sends her up in the air. After landing on her back, Callum is sent on to offer treatment. The game is delayed again. The game restarts and Worthing are quick to attack, with a long range effort rattling the bar.

Jade clears and Keynsham counter. Nay gets the ball out to Scarlett but she is forced wide from the defender, causing her shot to lack power.

With not long left, Keynsham work well to see the half off. Nellie and Emma win the ball together in midfield, to relieve pressure. Finally the whistle is blown.

Gamey start for the second half. Keynsham struggle to get the ball out of their own half and they are saved by Klaudia coming quick off her line to make a tackle.

MATCH REPORTS

55- Emma wins the ball well, from a dodgy Worthing pass, and plays it to Bea. Bea lets the ball roll through her legs to puzzle the defender and blasts the ball high into the goal! 2-0!!!

Keynsham look to be in control of the game but Worthing are still in the contest. Lily W does well to hold off an attacker, causing her to blast the ball miles over. Worthing are getting desperate and are starting to shoot long. Klaudia makes the save look easy and shows off her handling skills.

Keynsham break with Bea feeding Vicky who races through down the right. She cuts it back to Nay who gets a good shot off - but the keeper gets a feint touch to push wide. Keynsham win a corner.

Bea puts in a crunching tackle on a Worthing player. Play continues with Worthing desperate to get one back, but eventually the ball gets kicked out so the player can receive treatment. Keynsham resume and Bea forgets her sportsmanship to give the ball back. Her mistake is quickly fixed by captain Nay!

Worthing get another chance with their attacker running through on the edge on the box. However, their shot fails to test Klaudia and falls wide. Keynsham are quick to respond with Ciera sending Vicky through over the top of the defence. The ball just has too much top spin and their keeper is able to clear.

75- Brooke and Hannah come on for Scarlett and Nay. Vicky replaces Nay up top with two new wingers. Keynsham are adapting to the new subs and Worthing take advantage. Worthing finally hit the target and Klaudia makes the save.

79- Worthing finally get through, capitalising on a rare defensive slip and despite Klaudia forcing them wide, their player applies a clever finish which sees the ball in the back of the net (2-1).

80- It doesn't take Keynsham long to resume their 2 goal lead! - as almost immediately Lorna finds Brooke with a great ball forward, Brooke still has work to do, but rides a challenge with the Worthing defence and smashes the ball past the keeper! 3-1 KEYNSHAM!!

Mia comes on in defence. Jade is pushed up and replaces Nellie in midfield.

84- KEYNSHAM ARE FINDING THEIR GROOVE! Jade sends through super sub Brooke down the line. She finds Vicky in the box who slides the ball past the keeper. 4-1!!!

85- Lily R and Immy replace Ciera and Vicky.

Keynsham look to see the game off but Worthing aren't giving up. Keynsham get a lifeline as Worthing blasts an easy shot over the bar. Worthing are getting desperate and it shows. Bea gets elbowed in the shoulder by a frustrated Worthing player.

Klaudia takes the free kick and finds Immy in the box. But some quick defending from Worthing denies her shot.

A Worthing player receives a well deserved Yellow Card for a WWE challenge on Emma, literally throwing her to the ground in an off the ball incident!

Worthing decide to take another long range shot which creeps wide, Klaudia had it covered.

Lily R gets her body in front of a dangerous ball forward and her misplaced clearance screws up into the air and Klaudia rightly claims it. Worthing desperately shout for a back pass and the player, recently booked, is too over zealous and the ref sends her off for dissent, with a second yellow card.

And with that, the final whistle goes and Keynsham bag the 3 points.

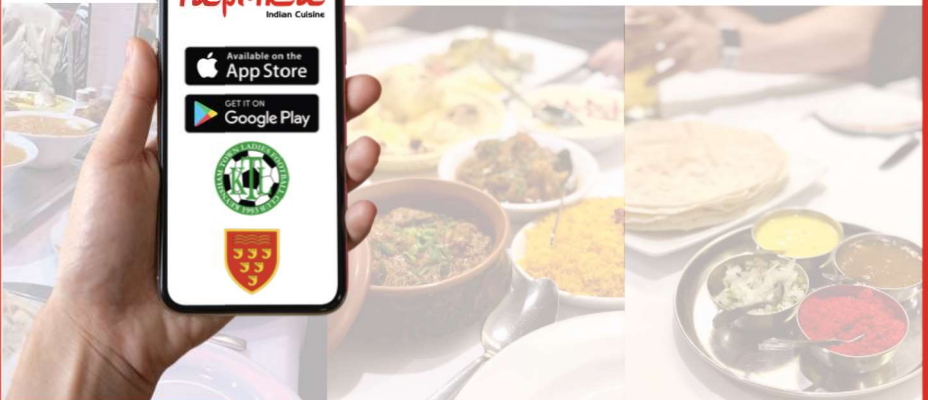
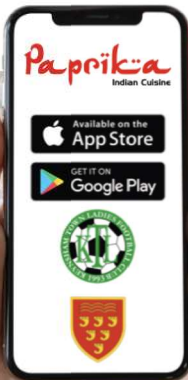
