MANAGER'S NOTES

Today is our first home fixture of 2025 as all the preceding games have been away and we are still in a busy schedule with most matches away. We have played more games at home than away and we will be evening out this in the next few weeks.

We welcome the players, staff and supporters from Bournemouth and trust they have had a safe journey up from the South Coast. Bournemouth are undefeated so far this season and everyone's favourites for promotion. They will be formidable opposition today. We understand that their monthly wage bill is many times what we can spend throughout our season on just running the whole club.



For this game, we are missing three of our squad members, Scarlett Mills (broken wrist), Immi Stocker (injured in training) and Emma Norris who has a recurrence of the problem from some time ago. This means that there are further opportunities for Development team players, like Megan Bible and Jenna Bakehouse, in line with our player development strategy.

One player that supporters will not have seen before is our new goalkeeper, Ella Stowell, who has joined us as a dual signing thanks to our friends at Bristol City. This all started when I was phoned up around Christmas Eve by our then goalkeeper, Klaudia. She told me that a football agent had contacted her via social media and asked if she would like to play in Europe. She told them 'Yes, but not until I finish this season in May.' Fair enough, but the 'football agent' swiftly came back and said that he had a club in Greece that wanted to sign Klaudia in order to help them get promotion to the Greek Super League and that if she was not in Greece by the 5th January, they would lose interest. The player made it clear that she was going to Greece and going to leave us somewhat in the lurch. Just what every manager wants for Christmas!

Since then, we heard from the 'football agent' in a rather strange message and it transpires that he is an insurance broker, not a football agent. We asked for correspondence from the Greek club secretary. Nothing has materialised, nor has there been any attempt to get international clearance. We have discovered that this is an amateur club that play in division 4C of the Greek pyramid. The player is 24 and has given up a perfectly good job with the NHS. There was no way I could stop her falling for this, except to advise she took enough money to get a return ticket home if it all went pear shaped. From what Sven Kierk tells me Greek football is something to avoid. Not sure if Klaudia is playing under her real name or not, but the team has lost their last 2 recent games, so any promotion looks unlikely in the future.

Anyway, in our search for a replacement we were fortunate that Liam Jaques, our goalkeeper coach knew the coach at BCFC. They wished Ella to go out and get some extra match experience. We are very lucky to have her sign for the rest of the season. Some may recall that her mother Rachel. Played here for Keynsham a while back.

Last week, we took up an offer from Oxford Utd for a friendly. Good preparation for today's game.

In the County Cup, we had a fairly comfortable win 2-0 at Regional League Ilminster Town. A nice

SECRETARY'S VIEWS

Welcome back to the AJN Stadium for our first home game of the year and welcome to our visitors AFC Bournemouth. We trust they were able to park their big bus in our car park - well they did ask.

I am pleased to say we met the Safe to Operate deadline for the League. This meant a lot of admin work so my Christmas tree did not go up until two days before Christmas and my Christmas cake didn't get made until Christmas Eve! On the plus side It saved me icing the cake and as I left it for a month to mature we are enjoying it now - the silver lining.

We now have to make sure we continue to meet the Save to Operate regulations at all times as meeting all of them is conditional on us remaining in the League. We also have the rest of the Minimum Standards to meet by April so, although the major stress (and believe me it was) of meeting the STO prior to 31st January has passed, we aren't done yet.

One of the Minimum Standards is to have a Board Safeguarding Officer and I am pleased to say we have managed to recruit (in accordance with our Minimum Standards recruitment policy) a very suitably qualified and experienced person. This puts another tick in the box.

I went to Ilminster for the County Cup game last week where a young U10 lass who goes to Yeovil Academy noticed we had a very good goalkeeper warming up. I recommended she grab Ella's autograph as one day she could be the England goalkeeper. See for yourselves today.

AFC Bournemouth Women

AFC Bournemouth Women were founded in 1992 as Bournemouth. They won the 2003-04 Southern Region Division One and then achieved a league and cup double for the 2005-06 season, winning the Southern Region Premier Division, and beating Slough Town 3-1 in the final of the Southern Region League Cup.



The club reached the final of the 2007–08 South West Combination League Cup, but were beaten 4-1 by Plymouth Argyle at Huish Park. However they were forced to withdraw from the league due to financial problems, and lack of managerial staff. The club ultimately folded in March 2009.

Bournemouth had reformed by 2012, playing in the Hampshire County Football League. The club achieved successive promotions, winning the 2014-15 Hampshire County Division Three, and the 2015–16 Hampshire County Division Two.

Manager Steve Davies left the club in 2019, with Bournemouth appointing Steve Cuss as manager ahead of the 2019-20 season. The club successfully applied for promotion to the FA Women's National League Division One South West for the 2021-22 season. Bournemouth made their competitive debut at Dean Court on 10 April 2022, in a 4-1 win against Chesham United.

Bournemouth have gone agonisingly close to promotion in each of the last two seasons, finishing as runners-up behind Cardiff City and Exeter City, but look well set to go one better this time around having won all of their opening ten matches. Last week they reached a national Final for the first time when they beat Manchester United Academy 3-2 in the semi finals of the League Plate, and they will face Cheltenham Town in the Final.




