FOOTBALL IN PERU

Outside its senior side, Peru also has the Olympic/U-23, U-20 and U-17 teams. A women's team also competes in other South American competitions.

In spite of its rich men's senior records, its youth teams have been mostly the lackluster of CONMEBOL competitions. The Olympic side of Peru has not qualified for the Summer Olympics since it became an U-23 competition in 1992. The U-20 team has competed in every South American Youth Football Championship but it has never qualified for any FIFA U-20 World Cup. Meanwhile, Peru has only managed to qualify for only one FIFA U-17 World Cup in 2007, outside being host of the 2005 FIFA U-17 World Cup. The women's team has never reached FIFA Women's World Cup, and has mainly competed in the Copa América Femenina.

PLAYER REGULATIONS 25-26

1, Training will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Allowance for work, travel and other commitments, but players need to make every effort to attend. Communication via Spond is essential, so sessions can be properly planned.

2. Management will make video coverage of matches where possible. Players will need to watch any footage available and participate in any other performance analysis provided. The club is investigating the provision of log books for each registered player and the possibility of reactivating the Cityplay tracking system.

3.Players will be allocated playing and training kit plus a club travel jacket. It will be obligatory to wear these at training and matches and when travelling. It is the players' responsibility to take good care of their kit.

4, The club will set objectives for each team at the start of the season. Personal objectives may be set for individual players.

5.Where possible, a record of appearances, goals and assists will be recorded through Full Time.

6.All players must remain on site on match days after each home game for at least 30 minutes, unless permission is obtained from the appropriate manager. This will be good for team spirit and save food wastage.

7.The club reserves the right to levy small fines for repeated wearing of wrong kit at training or on match days.

8. Management will explore the best way of nominating a 'Player of the Match at each game.

9.Players need to advise managers and coaches of match availability in good time. A target will be 14 days before the game, if players are away and unavailable.

10.If players are unhappy with any aspect of their football at Keynsham, then they should contact their manager or coach for a discussion. Only if they are still not happy, they may contact the club welfare officer or raise the matter with the CEO.

11. Should any player receive an approach from another club or person linked to another club, they should inform both their manager and the CEO at once. Should a player leave the club, then all kit must be returned to the manager or the CEO on departure. Under no circumstances should kit be returned via a third party, including another player. That can lead to lost and unchecked items.

12. Where the club provides transport for away matches, all players should intend to travel that way. If a player is geographically inconveniently located on that match day or there are other reasons to travel directly to the opponent's ground, then permission must be sought from the manager 7 days prior to the game not to be on the team bus. That permission will only be given in clearly defined situations. Travelling together as a team has many benefits for a team.

13. At all matches and training, players should assist managers and coaches by helping to collect equipment during and after the session.

14 Players need to ensure that any criticisms after matches are constructive and not in any way critical of team mates or management.

CEO's NOTES

In my new role as CEO, I will be taking time to watch each of our three senior teams. Today is a good example as I will not be watching the First Team (except on the recorded Veo video) and with no Development game scheduled until their season starts next weekend, I will be travelling to the new Moredon Sporting Hub, where our new 'A' team will play their first ever Wiltshire Premier League fixture away at FA Abbey Meads. Lets hope that the team can give a good account of themselves against a strong Abbey Meads side that played under the Purton name last season in the Regional League.

Bruno and Gwil should have a full squad of 16 players to use with a helpful rolling substitutes rule. For several players it will be their first ever senior match and we wish them all good luck.

The First team have made a very good start to the season with a win and a draw so far. We now have a good blend of experienced and younger players.

The Development team open their campaign next Sunday with a trip to Cheltenham Town in the FAWNL Reserve competition.

Next week, 7th September, the First team have a break from League fixtures and travel to Swindon Town in the League Cup followed by another away trip to Bournemouth Sports on the 14th. Next Sunday also sees the 'A' team start their home series of games with the visit of Calne Town to the AJN Stadium for a 2pm kick off.

Mention of the League Cup brings me onto our floodlight problem that caused the home League Cup fixture against Gwalia to be postponed until the 18th September. The delay in the repairs using the Phillips replacement board and drivers was due to a six week log-jam on delivery. These spare parts arrived this week and a full repair was effected on Thursday, so that all are now working as they should and we can prepare for that interesting evening League cup fixture. Our final game in this mini group series of games is on Sunday the 28th September when we have an exciting tie

It is pleasing to note that so far the club has not incurred any discipline cards. Last year we had too many cards for dissent and unsporting behaviour. Let us hope we have good improvements in future matches.

The fines system has been changed this season with the demise of the Whole Game system and the discipline matters are now handled via the new Club portal. We now have to raise the resultant invoices ourselves – all part of the FA's policy of taking on more employees to soak up the Premier League monies and yet still push more work onto volunteer club officials.

Respect Code of Conduct for spectators and parents/carers

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.

Keynsham Town Football Club is supporting The FA's Respect programme to ensure football can be enjoyed by everyone in a safe and positive environment.

I shall:

- Remain outside the field of play and behind the Designated Spectator Area (where provided).
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behaviour
- Always respect the match officials' decisions
- Refrain from smoking unless in a designated area
- Follow safety guidelines or instructions provided by club officials

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, league or The FA:

I may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league, or County Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Required to attend an FA education course
- Required to leave the stadium during the match
- Suspended by the club from attending matches
- Suspended or fined by the County FA
- Required to leave the club along with any dependants
