MANAGER'S NOTES

Today we resume the League programme after a break of three weeks. This was partly due to the bus breakdown which necessitated the postponement of our away trip to AFC Bournemouth and the third qualifying round of the Adobe FA Cup.

This will mean that some of our injury problems have been solved, although other longer term complications remain.

Today, we welcome Bridgwater to the AJN Stadium and trust that they have had a safe journey from the short trip from the coast in Somerset.



We have followed their transformation from Yeovil Town to Bridgwater with interest as the years have rolled by and see that the new Yeovil Town are just two divisions below Bridgwater, having got another promotion last year. We met Yeovil last season in the final of the County Cup, where we won 4-0.

Unfortunately, Bridgwater did not reply to any of the requests that we made by the allotted Tuesday correspondence and so there are no programme notes on their club, nor have we been able to ascertain if they are staying for food after the game and so we have not been able to provide any catering for post match food for them. The programme printer has 'guessed' their squad list from that listed on the last Full Time recorded list and the numbers are not given with any accuracy as they are approximate only.

I now turn to a matter that is rarely discussed in my notes, that of the new Minimum Standards and the Stadium Power assessments in particular. Spectators may not know much about this, but it is turning out to be a classic farce that Brian Rix would have been proud of. Somewhere deep within the Football Association somebody decided to lay down a requirement that also became a survey of all the football grounds in the England universe.

Of course the FA did not have the resources or skills to carry this out as their huge workforce are basically bureaucratic administrators, just like the County FAs. So, they decided to engage a series of 'consultants' to do the job for them, no doubt at great expense. In order to justify their large fees, these 'consultants' have, shall we say, been very pedantic. As a result, I have been told that only one club in England below step 4 in the men's grass roots survey – and that lucky club is said to be in Birmingham - has been able to pass the assessments that resulted. As to the women's game, as most female clubs rent their grounds, they will no doubt be in the same boat, but with no ability to rectify any failings. Here is a big joke in our case, where the 'consultant' turns up unannounced and does not ask anyone any questions and results in the men's team being told it has 5 failings and we are told that the women's team has 17. Well how can that be as we both use the same ground? When both of us write an email to Stadium Power we receive an auto reply saying they are inundated with queries and cannot reply!! Apparently, the men's Western League are so worried that they will have to relegate everyone that fails, if no corrections are made by March 2025 that clubs are having to fill in monthly progress reports when they cannot get any answer to their queries. The saga goes on and we wait to see what the FAWNLS says. So far they have not said anything.

Enjoy the match. Next week we are away at tier 3 Exeter City in the Adobe FA Cup; scant reward for the 8-1 win at AEK Boco in the previous round. It was even the last tie out of the hat.

Today we welcome Bridgwater United Women to the AJN although at one point we weren't sure if they would be coming as we'd had no confirmation. Anyway hopefully the game is going ahead and nobody arrived an hour early have forgotten to put their clocks back!

I seem to be spending a lot of time chasing up people. Last week it was Cheltenham whose Development team was due to play our Development in a Reserve League game at Cheltenham. Cheltenham only wanted to do a 12 noon kick off which we were unable to accommodate as their first team were playing an FAWNL game on the adjacent pitch. I can't quite work that one out. Any way they did not seem to have tried to find an alternative pitch and have been charged for non-fulfilment of a fixture.

We too have been charged with not fulfilling a fixture when we were unable to travel to AFC Bournemouth as our coach had broken down and we had difficulty finding out exactly what was happening as mobile communications between us and the driver were too crackly to decipher. My mobile, however, was in good use to Bournemouth, the League and the referees most of the morning, but eventually we reached the point of no return and had to unfortunately call the game off. (And release our players who were corralled in the clubhouse)

An interesting fact revealed by the referee for that game was that he had travelled 190 miles and stayed overnight for the game. It meant Bournemouth being asked to pay half his fees and the FA making up the rest. This apparently is a common occurrence to send referees excessive distances and the FA pay for them to stay overnight. So that's where the money goes. Crazy!

Anyway today's referee is actually Somerset registered and had a relatively short distance to travel. The assistants are travelling together so not such an expensive game.

As an update our player subjected to an horrendous tackle in the game against Bristol Rovers Women continues to make a steady recovery. Bristol Rovers, neither the club nor the player, have ever enquired or apologised for this appalling incident which many of our spectators witnessed. As it is their player was banned for three games, the standard FA punishment.

REGULATING FOOTBALL..

GOVERNMENT PROPOSALS FOR AN INDEPENDENT FOOTBALL REGULATOR.

(Note: not for Female football and can only be more bureaucracy on top of the FA.)

The Football Governance Bill will establish a new Independent Football Regulator (IFR) for English men's elite football. The IFR will be set up as a new public body to ensure its operational independence and accountability. It will have three primary objectives. They are:

1. **Club financial soundness-** to protect and promote financial sustainability of regulated clubs, ensuring that clubs take sensible financial decisions and consider the long-term when taking risks.
2. **Systemic financial resilience-** to protect and promote the financial resilience of English football as a whole, ensuring that systemic risks and structural issues like the distribution of revenue through the pyramid are managed appropriately.
3. **Heritage-** to safeguard the traditional features of English football that matter most to the fans and local communities of clubs.

The IFR will not lawfully be able to act outside its remit defined in the Bill and every action it takes must, so far as is reasonably practicable, advance one or more of these three objectives.

The IFR has a duty to consider several 'secondary' outcomes that are important in the football industry but are not the direct responsibility of the IFR:

- sporting competition
- the competitiveness of regulated clubs (including against international rivals)
- investment into English football

The IFR will not act to directly influence these outcomes. While some indirect impacts will be unavoidable, the IFR will seek to avoid them where possible. This recognises that sustainability should not be pursued at the expense of all else.

The IFR must also have regard to seven 'regulatory principles' when operating. These principles are based on best practice from existing regulators, but tailored to the unique nature of the football industry:

1. Use its resources in the most efficient, expedient time and economic way.
2. Co-operate, and proactively and constructively engage, with clubs; owners, senior managers and other officers of clubs; and competition organisers.
3. Any requirement or restriction imposed on a person should be proportionate to the benefits which are expected to result from that requirement or restriction.
4. Act in a way that recognises the specific context of football and the fact that clubs are already subject to rules, restrictions and burdens by virtue of their membership of or participating in competitions.
5. Act consistently (subject to it recognising the differences between clubs and competitions and the differences between the circumstances affecting clubs and competitions).
6. Act in a way that recognises the responsibilities of owners, senior managers and other officers of clubs in relation to the requirements placed on clubs by the legislation.
7. Act as transparently as reasonably practicable.

The IFR will operate a licensing system where all clubs in scope will require a licence to operate. The intention is for the scope to cover all clubs in the top five tiers of men's English football. Through the licensing system, the IFR will have powers to apply and enforce requirements related to financial regulation, fan engagement, and protection of club heritage, as well as improving governance standards by publishing a football club corporate governance code for clubs to report against. It will also have the power to prohibit clubs from joining unmeritocratic breakaway competitions, such as the European Super League.

Separately, the IFR will have the power to test the suitability of incumbent and prospective owners and directors, and operate a backstop mechanism to make sure there is sufficient distribution of finances across the professional game if football can't reach an agreement on this itself. MATCH REPORTS

KEYNSHAM TOO STRONG FOR LOCAL SIDE BOCO

The Ks make the short journey to Hanham where they take on AEK Boco in the FA Cup.

Keynsham start brightly with very clean passes, despite a bobbly pitch. Lily sends Scarlett through the defensive line as Scarlett sets Nay up from a good cross, which just falls wide. Another good chance for Keynsham as Vicky gets the ball in the box. She turns the defender well but the ball smashes against the side netting.

Keynsham keep at it and try to force more chances. The Boco goalkeeper is quick off her line to clear another through ball. Boco get the first corner of the game as Jade is forced to clear a clever cross from the opposition.

The Boco goalkeeper makes a solid save from a one-on-one with Vicky and then saves the follow up from Nay. Despite Keynsham's determination, the game remains goalless.

15mins: KEYNSHAM FINALLY GET THROUGH! An excellent corner cross from Scarlett, followed by a pearly header from Jade puts Keynsham 1-0 up!!

16mins: And as I was typing the first goal, Keynsham score again!! Nay feeds Bea through as the lobs the goalkeeper from 25 yards out. Keynsham 2-0 up!!

18mins: The teams are putting on a show today! Boco's number 10 brings down a through on the edge of the box and smashes the volley over Klaudia. Keynsham 2 Boco 1.

The goal has given Boco a bit of energy as our defence are called into the match. Youngster Jessie holds the ball off well enough to get it safely to Klaudia, who clears it up the line.

The game is quiet for a few minutes with some good battles in midfield. Bea wins Keynsham a foul to push the team up the pitch. Keynsham win another corner, taken by Scarlett. Nay attempts to flick the corner ball over the keeper but too much power causes the ball to fly over the bar. Keynsham get back in control with Scarlett getting a shot blocked on the edge of the box. Bea shoots on the follow up but the ball floats into the keepers hands. Nay dances around the defender to finally get her goal but the defender recovers and the ball goes wide for a corner.

31mins: Scarlett's corner cross again creates havoc in the box, causing Keynsham to win scrappy goal. It's not the goal we wanted but we'll certainly take it. (Nay gets the final touch). Keynsham 3 Boco 1!!

33mins: KEYNSHAM FIND THEIR RHYTHM!!!! Scarlett makes a brilliant run down the line to cross the ball into the box. The Boco keeper spills the ball and Bea punishes with a smashing shot into the top corner. 4-1!!!!

36mins: Bea gets her hat-trick!! Vicky crosses the ball into the box as Bea volleys it straight in! Keynsham are 5-1 up!

39mins: Quote from Bea "Justine, that's the shooting practise paying off." Wise words from our midfielder as she smashes her 4th goal into the top corner. Keynsham 6 Boco 1!!

44mins: Nay gets her second! A collected turn on the edge of the box followed by a great left foot finish into the top corner gives Keynsham their seventh!!! (7-1)

HT: KEYNSHAM 7 AEK BOCO 1.

Only one sub to be made at HT. Lily R replaces Ciera in the centre. The second half starts a little slow and Boco are punishing us. Klaudia is called into action twice. She makes an impressive one-on-one save with the Boco goal scorer. Straight after, she showcases good handling from a Boco cross.

Boco get a free kick from the edge of the box. Luckily for Keynsham the ball is blasted over the bar. Keynsham find their feet again with some quick chances, set up by Emma and Scarlett. Eventually Nay's shot gets forced wide by a defender.

59mins: Subs are made to give Keynsham fresh legs. Sophie and Hannah come on for Bea and Scarlett.

Boco get a string of corners as Keynsham struggle to clear. Eventually Lily R makes a good block on the edge, and Sophie follows up and clears the ball wide. Nellie puts her body on the line for the Keynsham defence, with a studs up challenge giving her a gash on her leg. Physio Callum is called into action for the first time in the game.

Nay sets up Vicky on the edge of the box. But Boco defend like a pack of wolves and Vicky couldn't find the room to turn. Hannah drives down the line, finding Nellie in the middle. The shot unfortunately falling straight into the keepers hands. Hannah drives again, this time finding Vicky on the edge of the box. But her shot blasts above the bar.

74mins: Subs made as our second youngster makes her debut. Nikki replaces Emma in defence. A minute later, An atrocious foul into the back of Lily R leaves her needing to come off. Our final sub Justine comes on for the final 15.

Nikki and Jessie link up well to defend a clever ball from Boco. Eventually Klaudia clears.

Keynsham have been quiet this half but still have chances. Nay sends Sophie through the middle, but some clever defending from Boco forces her wide and Keynsham win a corner.

86mins: SUPER SUB JUSTINE SCORES!! Nay sends in the corner to find Justine, who slides the ball into the bottom corner. Keynsham 8 Boco 1!!!

Right in the last minute, Nikki blasts the ball into the box. Justine flicks it on to Hannah, who was unfortunately called offside. And with that, the ref blows the whistle and Keynsham are through to the next round of the FA cup.

EXETER DOWNED BY CLINICAL KEYNSHAM

KEYNSHAM DEVS returned to League action and welcomed Exeter City Reserves to the AJN stadium. Exeter started on the front foot but Keynsham defended well - Mandy with a superb trade mark challenge was the pick of the opening exchanges.

At the other end, Keynsham opened Exeter up when Angel W freed Jenna B, but after seemingly composing herself superbly - she steered her shot narrowly off target. A huge let off for Exeter.

Keynsham were battling well, whilst Exeter dominated possession, but were finding Keynsham superbly compact and hard to break through.

The counter attack looked on for Keynsham. Meg B with a fantastic outside of the foot pass, saw the defender almost cut it out, but Jenna B won the footrace with the keeper and almost walked the ball in to give Keynsham an early lead! (1-0)

Chloe was forced into a good save by her front post, as Exeter looked to make a quick response. Zoe HG great pass saw Brooke almost get on the end and then almost cut the keeper's clearance out.

Exeter were awarded a free-kick in a dangerous area, but Chloe produced a fantastic save to tip the effort wide! Exeter with their best chance to date as a great cross is well defended by Ella who just gets her body across a player, so she could only steer an effort wide.

A bit of controversy - as Brooke won a free kick out wide, Ella's excellent free kick then sees Brooke steer home, the ref gives the goal, the Lino flags offside. Very close! The game is well posed. Frantic, high tempo and energy with both teams trying to play football.

MATCH REPORTS

26 mins. Ella's corner - is superbly flicked goalwards by Angel W and crosses the line after hitting the inside of the post. (2-0)

Keynsham really have the bit between their teeth now and a superb pinch by Megan B and driving run forward, saw her smash in a brilliant left foot finish!! (3-0)

Alice T superb tracking back wins the ball in the full back position - she plays it to Martha who sends a great pass forward to Jenna, who still has lots to do, she cuts in, beats one, drops the shoulder, beats another and fires high into the net!! (4-0)

Four quickly becomes FIVE, as Keynsham are rampant with their clinical finishing! Jenna turns provider with a great pass through and Brooke's lobbed cross nestles in the top corner!!! (5-0)

The game is being played at such a high tempo. Exeter to their credit haven't given this one up yet and a really good cross - sees Chloe get a touch to divert it for a corner - which she then claims! Exeter fire in a fierce strike, Chloe produces another fantastic save to maintain her clean sheet and thwart Exeter once more.

Both teams are still battling hard - the game remains a frantic pace. Half time can't come quickly enough for the supporters to find a breath.

HT: KEYNSHAM DEVS 5 EXETER CITY RES 0

The half time team talk centred around more of the same and to expect (and match) a fast start from Exeter. Keynsham are really compact and Exeter, whilst seeing a lot of possession, are struggling to break through and create any meaningful chances. A Mandy challenge sees Exeter win a corner. The corner sees a player fire narrowly wide of the target - with a load of bodies on the line.

Exeter have started strong - but Keynsham are weathering well and posing a problem on the break. Brooke leads a good charge which saw Maddie, Erin and Loz almost find an opening for a shot. Zoe brilliant win and pass to Maddie, who then threads a lovely pass through, which Brooke forces the defender to clear for a corner. Zoe another great pinch - before Loz did the same and releases Brooke, whose cross was just cleared in front of Maddie.

Almost a GOAL OF THE SEASON CONTENDER, when Maddie releases Erin who races down the wing - and her cross saw Maddie flick the ball back to Loz who fired in a fantastic volley from 30+ yards - which the keeper did well to flick wide!

Loz with another superb challenge and pinch - Maddie releases Jenna who, with a hat trick in her sights, just lobs wide of the target with the keeper having no chance. Jenna superb cross saw Jess B surely clatter in the penalty area, but nothing given - Maddie almost recycled, but Exeter clear.

Jenna B another wriggle free and run - before the defender made a superb challenge, but pulling Jenna back by the arm, but again nothing given. Exeter are still valiantly trying - but Keynsham are creating by far the better chances.

Lovely football by Keynsham - Alice and Jenna combine to see Maddie fire a shot just off target.

Exeter win a dangerous freekick just outside the area by the corner flag - after Meg is deemed too strong - a great cross is headed wide by an Exeter player.

Keynsham are seeing this out very well indeed and another counter almost sees Maddie break through, before Jess B fires narrowly off target from distance.

The ref blows his final whistle & Keynsham get their first 3 points of the season, with a fantastic team performance, which was both COMPACT in defence and CLINICAL in attack!

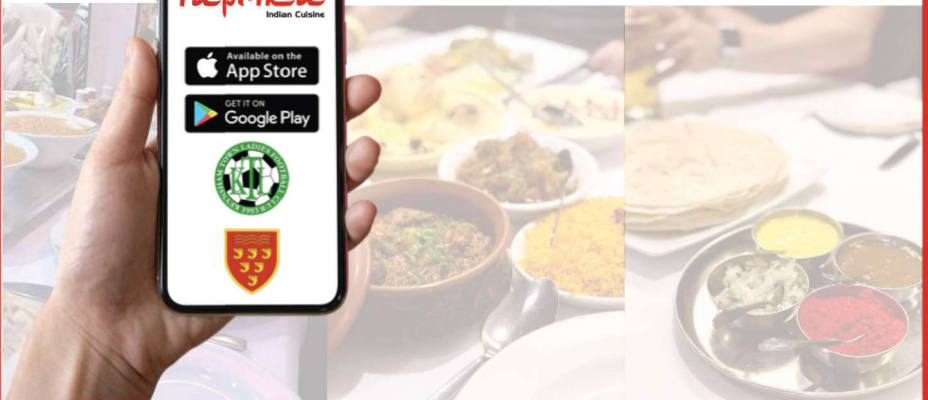
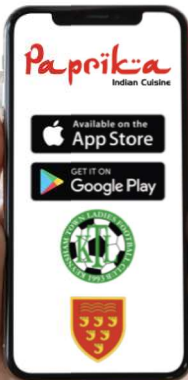

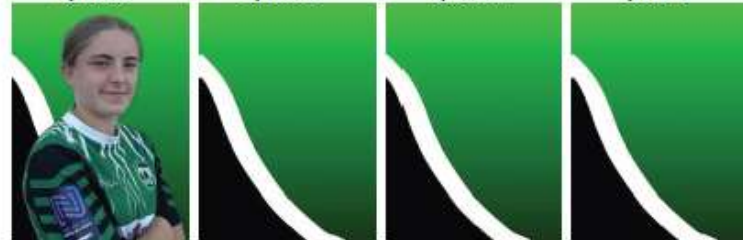
