SECRETARY'S VIEWS

So another season begins with quite a few changes as we look forward to an exciting season. Barrie has moved up to be CEO after probably being a longer serving manager than Sir Alex Ferguson. He took the Club from a 6-a-side team to the giddy heights of the Second Division of the Women's Premier League, the highest level of the Women's Pyramid pre-WS1 And WS2. We played all the main teams including Arsenal in the League Cup. Now we are at Level 4 with aspirations to rise to Tier 3 in what is a very different game.

We welcome our new first team Manager Mark Graham and coach Jo Johnson-Taylor. Sven Kierk continues as manager of the Development team with Justine Lorton as coach. We also now have a third team, Keynsham Town A, who will play in the Premier Division of the Wiltshire Women's League managed by Bruno Mallet with coach Gwilym Jenkins.

We also have lots of new players along with our regular stalwarts including our very own Justine Lorton to look out for. Sadly we will be missing Naomi Clipston, Captain and player who has been forced to retire from football due to injury. Following a serious operation we hope she will be able to walk again. We all send Naomi our best wishes.

It has been a busy time signing on our teams, staff and players, not to mention the continuing saga of Minimum Standards and Safe to Operate requirements by the League. Strangely, whoever marked ours reduced us from 74% compliance in January to 43% in April. How can that be? I do not know but one club with 90% in January is now down to 73%. Ours has been upgraded to 75% but there are still 3 Safe to Operate standards which require a little work. Instead of being beaten with a big stick however, the League are dangling the carrot that all Clubs who achieve the 10 Safe to Operate Standards by the end of the month will receive £2,000. That's a better incentive.

Well I still continue as Club Secretary working mostly behind the scenes but I will be stepping back from doing so much on match days as others step up, thank you.

Enjoy today's game against newly promoted Marine Academy Plymouth (who were my hot tip last season). It promises to be a good one.

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PLAYER REGULATIONS 25-26

1, Training will be on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Allowance for work, travel and other commitments, but players need to make every effort to attend. Communication via Spond is essential, so sessions can be properly planned.

2. Management will make video coverage of matches where possible. Players will need to watch any footage available and participate in any other performance analysis provided. The club is investigating the provision of log books for each registered player and the possibility of reactivating the Cityplay tracking system.

3.Players will be allocated playing and training kit plus a club travel jacket. It will be obligatory to wear these at training and matches and when travelling. It is the players' responsibility to take good care of their kit.

4, The club will set objectives for each team at the start of the season. Personal objectives may be set for individual players.

5.Where possible, a record of appearances, goals and assists will be recorded through Full Time.

6.All players must remain on site on match days after each home game for at least 30 minutes, unless permission is obtained from the appropriate manager. This will be good for team spirit and save food wastage.

7.The club reserves the right to levy small fines for repeated wearing of wrong kit at training or on match days.

8. Management will explore the best way of nominating a 'Player of the Match at each game.

9.Players need to advise managers and coaches of match availability in good time. A target will be 14 days before the game, if players are away and unavailable.

10.If players are unhappy with any aspect of their football at Keynsham, then they should contact their manager or coach for a discussion. Only if they are still not happy, they may contact the club welfare officer or raise the matter with the CEO.

11. Should any player receive an approach from another club or person linked to another club, they should inform both their manager and the CEO at once. Should a player leave the club, then all kit must be returned to the manager or the CEO on departure. Under no circumstances should kit be returned via a third party, including another player. That can lead to lost and unchecked items.

12. Where the club provides transport for away matches, all players should intend to travel that way. If a player is geographically inconveniently located on that match day or there are other reasons to travel directly to the opponent's ground, then permission must be sought from the manager 7 days prior to the game not to be on the team bus. That permission will only be given in clearly defined situations. Travelling together as a team has many benefits for a team.

13. At all matches and training, players should assist managers and coaches by helping to collect equipment during and after the session.

14 Players need to ensure that any criticisms after matches are constructive and not in any way critical of team mates or management.

CEO's NOTES

This has been quite a busy run up to the start of the season.

Despite handing over first team matters to Mark Graham as my successor after 33 years, founding and running the club, circumstances continue to load yet more work on club volunteers, especially from the demands of the FA and our main League, the FA Women's National League.

We have a younger aged team, still with important experienced players this season and the hope is that the First team will be able to improve on last season's creditable 6th position in the League.

We have a new member of staff in the First team set up and I can welcome Jo Johnson-Taylor to Keynsham as First team coach. Jo lives nearby in Bath and so will not have the travel distance that her predecessor had coming all the way from Minehead. Jo is an ex Bristol City player and her experience will be valuable in her role.

This season, the FA Women's National League has changed the format for the League Cup and Plate competitions. Historically, there had just been one determining round before the winning teams enter the League cup and the losing sides progress to the plate competition.

This year, there is a determining group and we have been placed in a group with Swindon Town, Gwalia, Bristol City U21s and Keynsham Town. This mini league will decide the clubs entering the League Cup and the Plate as a result of a club's performance in the mini League. This format gives us additional matches which is welcome. These fixtures are mostly on a Sunday, but the first, which is home to Welsh side Gwalia from Tier 3, was scheduled for Thursday 21st August, but with our unusual problems with the floodlighting column we do not have full floodlighting that evening. This is because the replacement drivers are supplied from the Phillips' factory in Spain and there is a delay of six weeks in obtaining them. Hopefully, the repairs to that column will be completed later in this month. Meanwhile, the FAWN, Gwalia and ourselves have agreed to move the match to Thursday 18th September.

May I thank all parents for their help and support for their daughters who play at Keynsham. This is so important. No better example than Liz Fogarty's parents who have flown from Florida to watch Liz make her debut for the First team today.

For season 2025-6, we have started a third team described as Keynsham Town 'A'. This has a number of our U16 side. From last year. If we had entered the County League of our parent County, Somerset, we would have had to start in Division three, where many games are only 9-a-side. That is no good for any player. If we had entered into The Gloucestershire County system, then it would have meant starting in Division four. Again, a very low level and light years away from promotion to the Regional league. As it is, we have been accepted into the Wiltshire Premier League which is a very good standard of play because we are seen as a progressive club with a working pathway. It also has limited travel content and is only one promotion to the Regional League. The first match for the 'A' team is on Sunday 31st August away at FC Abbey Meads. I wish Bruno Mallett and Gwil Jenkins, who are running this side, good luck in this venture, where I will be taking a keen interest.

Now for an amusing storey from our friends at Barnsley Women FC, who play in Division One Midlands at the Steel City Stadium. They arranged an away pre-season friendly at a local rival club. The Barnsley players were shown into the away changing rooms prior to the game and plonked down their bags and the like and changed. When they sat down on the seating, they tried to get up afterwards and could not! The seats had wet paint and all the players' shorts were first stuck and then ruined by the paint. With some ingenuity, the match was completed and subsequently Barnsley Women has had to fork out £800 for new kit for its players. Unfortunately, the opponents have turned a deaf ear to requests to reimburse Barnsley for the ruined kit and the matter may have to be settled through the Small Claims Court. Hopefully, there will be a solution rather than the current 'sticky end'.



SHAPING THE FUTURE...

The FA Women's National League (FA WNL) has released its new strategy 'Where Our Game Grows', which will shape the future and direction of the league between 2025-2028. The strategy outlines four key priority areas to further the development of the league and wider women's football pyramid and is once again supported with investment from the Premier League.

'Where Our Game Grows' aims to build on the strong foundations laid by the FA WNL's previous strategy 'Empowering for Success', which helped contribute to an 100% increase in average match attendances since 2021 and saw the introduction of minimum standards across the league. The focus for the next three years is on building on those successes, with an overarching vision of championing growth, elevating performance and building identity.

To help achieve this, four key strategic priorities have been identified:

1. Environment – Elevate the football environment to foster excellence both on and off the pitch. There will be a focus on propelling club standards, protecting and enhancing positive culture and behaviour, and enhancing league delivery.
2. People – Champion progressive pathways, nurture diversity and unlock potential. This will establish a system that supports players, referees, coaches, and club staff in achieving their goals, fosters inclusive and welcoming experiences throughout the WNL, and ensures access to top-quality facilities that enable everyone to thrive.
3. Impact – Build visibility, engage diverse audiences, and leverage the power of community to grow the league's profile and reach. There will be a focus on raising the profile of the WNL through innovative storytelling, supporting clubs to become the heart of their communities, and educating and influencing key football stakeholders to support the growth and development of the WNL.
4. Commercial – Elevate commercial focus, attract and collaborate with partners and clubs to increase the sustainability of the WNL. This will include driving commercial readiness across the competition, establishing meaningful partnerships across the WNL, and providing tailored club support to promote financial sustainability.

Five threads weave throughout each strategic priority and will be key to the strategy's overall success across the three years: diversity and inclusion, facilities, female health and wellbeing, safeguarding, and technology and data.

Sue Hough, Chair of the FA Women's National League Board, said: "We saw sustained growth throughout the previous strategy but now it's time to step things up as we look to grow the profile and reach of the league and leverage the commercial opportunities within the women's game. The Women's National League is 'Where Our Game Grows' – it's the connection between the professional game and our grassroots players. Over the next three years we will ensure we offer our people, both on and off the pitch, the best environments to enable them and the league to thrive."

Nick Frith, Head of the Women's Football Pyramid at The FA, added: "We are proud to be launching 'Where our Game Grows', a new strategy and roadmap that will shape the future of our league. The next three years will be about driving forward a series of initiatives that raise standards on and off the pitch. From enhancing club governance and championing progressive pathways to building partnerships and supporting clubs to unlock new revenue streams, we are focused on building a sustainable, inclusive and innovative league."

Respect Code of Conduct for spectators and parents/carers

We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.

Keynsham Town Football Club is supporting The FA's Respect programme to ensure football can be enjoyed by everyone in a safe and positive environment.

I shall:

- Remain outside the field of play and behind the Designated Spectator Area (where provided).
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behaviour
- Always respect the match officials' decisions
- Refrain from smoking unless in a designated area
- Follow safety guidelines or instructions provided by club officials

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA, league or The FA:

I may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league, or County Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Required to attend an FA education course
- Required to leave the stadium during the match
- Suspended by the club from attending matches
- Suspended or fined by the County FA
- Required to leave the club along with any dependants

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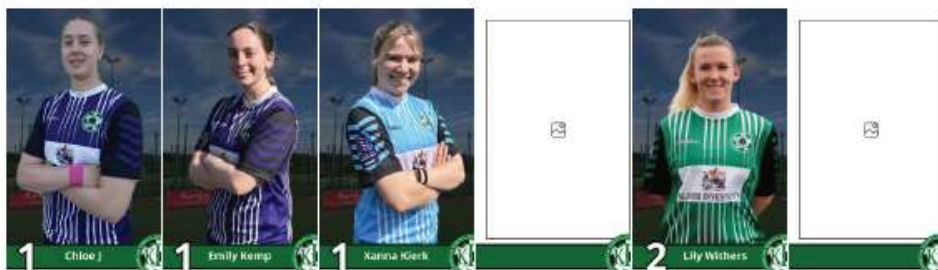
